

ACTIVITY | The Big Beach Shore! Biodiversity Survey

Saturday 10.00am | Back Beach

Join Dave Wall, Citizen Science Officer at the National Biodiversity Data Centre at the back beach. We will be exploring the beach area to photograph and identify bivalve shells, seaweeds and other flotsam cast up on the shore. The remains of species cast up by the tide can be a useful indicator of what is living beneath the adjacent waves and helps us map the distribution of marine species around the Irish coast. Learn about monitoring your local shore, improving your marine species identification skills, and contributing to our knowledge of Ireland's coastal biodiversity.

DANNY RENTON: Seagrass and Native Oyster restoration, Loch Craignish, Scotland - A community-based approach to restoring degraded marine habitats.

Seawilding is a community-led charity based at Loch Craignish, Argyll, Scotland, which is working to restore degraded seagrass meadows, establish native oyster beds and generally enhance the health of the local sea-loch. The talk will look at the joys, the challenges, and the need for this kind of action.

SIMON BERROW: Brandon and Tralee Bays: An MPA for Bottlenose dolphins.

Brandon and Tralee Bays are important habitats for the small population of genetically discrete bottlenose dolphins from the Shannon. Since 2014 the IWDG have been building the evidence to support its designation as an MPA. But what would this mean to users of these bays? Would this enhance the economic and potential and conservation status or restrict activities? Would MPA status help protect this vulnerable dolphin population and how can we bring local stakeholders onboard for protection to be effective?

TALK | For Peat Sake RE-IMAGINING OUR PEATLANDS

Sunday 3.30pm-5.00pm | The Barn

The session will introduce peatlands and the important ecosystem services they provide to society, including their roles as carbon stores, as habitats for biodiversity, in buffering extreme weather events such as droughts and floods, and in providing cultural, recreational and wellness benefits to surrounding communities.



We will hear from speakers from RE-PEAT, a youth-led collective pushing for a peatland paradigm shift through collaboration, education, and a process of re-imagining and Peatlands and People, a 7-year EC-funded LIFE Integrated Project, led by Bord na Móna.

- Arthur Devine is the Technical Program Manager for the EU LIFE Integrated Project Peatlands and People.
- David McNicholas is an Ecologist at Bord na Móna.

This session will also include a screening of *Bog Standard* a short documentary film that focuses on community-led bog restoration projects and the custodians who have extraordinary stories to tell. The film draws on the commitment and hope of grassroot projects happening around peatland conservation in Ireland, and responds to the need for awareness of peatlands in Ireland and their central role within the climate emergency.
